# Spiritual Check-Up

There are many ways to check the spiritual health of a congregation, including attendance at worship, participation in congregational events, the abundance of volunteers for serving and people who are eager to invite their friends and family to church.

But what about giving?

I once heard an older and wiser pastor tell me, "Scott, churches never have financial issues, only spiritual ones. You address the spiritual issues, and the financial ones will take care of themselves." I have come to believe this to be true at Christ Lutheran.

At the end of September, we have received 99.04% of our budgeted income. At the same time, we have spent 95.22% of our budgeted expenditures. That is remarkable to have a 3.1 million dollar income and be that close in our financial management. I would like to point to an amazing Finance Committee that monitors every dime and pays monthly attention to all the details, but that's not it. I would like to thank the staff for watching their individual budget closely to not overspend, but that's not it. As crass as it may seem, this is one more barometer of the spiritual health at Christ Lutheran.

And I would say that we are very healthy!

When you fill out your Intention Card each year, we pay close attention to it. We don't add a fudge factor or second guess your commitments. We trust you. We assume that you will make good on the amount you put down. And you do. After 20 years of doing this, we know that if a person puts down a number, they complete that amount between 99%-101%. These cards are very important to us as we try to be good and faithful stewards of these trusted resources. The more I can encourage you to return your card, the more faithful we can be with our financial plan.

I don't want to suggest that giving is the only means to check the spiritual health of a congregation, but it is a significant one. Jesus said that where your treasure is, there your heart will be, also. You have entrusted to us the treasures of your money. But you are doing far more than that. You are also sharing with us the gift of your hearts. We don't take either gift lightly.

Thank you for the trust. Thank you for the generosity. Thank you for sharing your hearts. And as your doctor, I've checked it out and I am happy to report that your hearts are in the right place. You are spiritually healthy.

Can the basic human desire to be happy come from the perfect present? Yes, but not the kind found under a tree. It comes from the presence of the living God who draws close to us. Solomon sees God's presence fill the temple as the Ark is brought inside. Elizabeth realizes God is present when Mary visits her. Jesus comes to ReSet our joy. Rejoice! Where do you see joy breaking in today? ---1 Kings 8:1, 6, 22-30; Isaiah 35:1-10; Luke 1:39-45

#### **December 22 • ReSet Our Peace**





# Are You Taking a Required Minimum Distribution?

If you have an IRA and you are 70  $\frac{1}{2}$  or older and you give to the church, I want you to reconsider how you make your contributions.

Did you know that at 70  $\frac{1}{2}$  you are required to take a disbursement from your IRA? (It's called a Required Minimum Distribution, or RMD). Typically, this would come to you as taxable income. After you paid income tax on it, then most people write a check to the church from the remaining amount.

However, you can direct your IRA to pay that disbursement directly to Christ Lutheran, not pay any taxes on it, and contribute more. It's called a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD).

Here is a scenario:

Say for example you are required to take \$5,000 from your IRA. You pay the taxes on it (let's say 25%) and you have \$3,750 left over to contribute. -OR- You can direct that same \$5,000 from your IRA and have it sent directly to Christ Lutheran. You skip paying income tax on it and can contribute the entire \$5,000.

Of course, I'm not giving tax advice to anyone, but I would ask you to check this out with a trusted financial person you know and see how you can fulfill your giving to the church AND save in taxes through your IRA disbursement. It just makes good sense!

# **Exciting News From Christ South**

Since our last update, a lot has happened at South. If you've been by the Old Dairy Farm lately, you'll see that there have been a lot of changes. In addition to Thrive Day School relocating on the property, you'll see a nice big deck has been constructed overlooking our natural amphitheater. This will be utilized for community events going forward and helps us to utilize our space better. House #2 has been renamed The Lodge and converted into usable space for the Christ South band rehearsal and for Sunday morning youth meetings.

The Old Dairy Farm board of directors continues to work on strengthening the mission and vision of how to use the land for His glory. In September, we dedicated the land by walking the property as families with prayer stones and praying over the different areas where future buildings will be constructed. This was followed by a land blessing and worship service with bonfires and s'mores into the evening.

Not to be outdone, the Southman group had their fall retreat in October as a follow-up to the spring meeting where they focused on deepening connections with other men and finding places where life and faith meet daily. There was paintball, there were naps, there was a huge bonfire and tons of earplugs for the snoring.

Christ Providence hosts 10 guests each Thursday evening to Friday morning in the area around Center Six, located in the classrooms behind Cornerstone Cafe. A lot of these guests are folks you may have seen on the streets of Charlotte. Our guests include men, women, and moms and dads with kids, both old and young. They may sleep in tents, under bridges, in their car or any place they can find. We host them to provide some normalcy in their lives. We do that by sharing a meal, having fellowship, watching a movie or just a simple conversation. Many of our guests encounter people every day who avoid eye contact with them. Room In The Inn is an opportunity for us to connect with our guests. We do not try to change them; we treat them like guests in our home.

Our volunteers provide transportation from and back to uptown, dinner, breakfast and a bagged lunch. Our church is very special to the guests because they each receive their own room.

This season for Room In The Inn will be the 23rd year Christ Lutheran has participated in the program. During that time we have hosted Room In The Inn in six different locations on our Providence campus. Throughout all of our growth, we've always found a way to keep the program going. In 22 years we have hosted over 3600 guests, with 12 volunteers involved each week in the hospitality required to make this program a success. That translates into over 4300 volunteers over the years!

Our volunteers are what have made this program work for all these years. If you have participated, you know what a great experience it is for adults and children alike. If you have not had the opportunity, please consider helping out this season. We are always in need of drivers to pick up the guests and also overnight hosts, but glad to have any and all that want to serve.

# **McPIE Grant Funding**

McPIE has been working diligently on securing resources and funding for our school year and summer programming. We are excited to announce that we have recently received three big grants!

For a 4th round of funding, McPIE's Summer Science Camp has been awarded \$179,967 to fund 3 more summers of camp. This is exciting news! The Burroughs Wellcome Fund monies will enable 200 rising 6th, 7th and 8th graders to investigate science using experiential learning and hands-on activities, while also preventing summer learning loss.

Charlotte Mecklenburg Community Foundation (CMCF) awarded McPIE \$11,450 toward our Family Nights programming. These funds will help provide much needed Tuesday night meals and transportation, breaking a major barrier for family participation. Funding from CMCF is geared toward family stability and will also be used toward Family Nights Pathways Out of Poverty classes for parents.

Dreams do come true! The ELCA Big Dream grant was awarded to McPIE to begin a new program at McClintock Middle School a few nights a week. With the addition of a state-of-the-art McClintock Innovation

Lab and Library (MILL), students and parents will have the opportunity to come into the MILL a few nights a week, to use new technology and equipment and learn job skills training toward future employment!

McPIE is blessed to have been awarded funding toward these much-needed programs. With the help of local and national funders, McPIE's dream and mission of "Creating Future Stories...Building Community... Supporting Families...and Inspiring Volunteers...So that ALL McClintock students succeed," is moving forward!

# **McPIE Family Nights**

Family Nights kicked-off at McClintock Middle School on September 24th with Registration Night! We served over 450 meals, fueling students and families to meet and mingle with club leaders! McClintock Middle School students have 20 club options ranging from Robotics, Innovation Lab and Cyber Spy to Woodworking, Sketch Squad and Top Scot Chef.
